February 18, 1954 - September 9, 2017

William J. Weber passed away peacefully on September 9, 2017 after a courageous eight-year battle with mesothelioma. He was 63. He was born on February 18, 1954 in Cleveland, Ohio, the oldest son of William P. Weber and Jeanne R. (Kennedy) Weber. He was a loving husband, father, brother, uncle, and friend to all.

He was preceded in death by his mother. He leaves to cherish his memory his loving wife - his "sweetheart" Kwon, his children; Meghan and Bill, his father, his sister Maureen, and four brothers; Robert, Bernard, Thomas and Gregory.

William graduated from Kent State University in 1976, with a degree that focused on Computer Information Systems, one of the earliest recipients of that degree. William's initial work experiences with computers led him into the healthcare industry. He developed a national reputation in Healthcare informatics through designing and consulting on some of the first integrated computer healthcare systems. His work serves as a model today for many large academic medical centers.

As a product of a Jesuit education, William embraced the motto of "men for others." He was an active volunteer for charitable causes such as: Habitat for Humanity and the homeless ministry at his church. William was a devoted member of Saint Agatha / Saint James Church in Philadelphia where he volunteered many hours as an altar server and as a member of the Finance Committee. He also served as a volunteer firefighter for the Township of Randolph, NJ and was a Lifetime Member of the New Jersey State Firemen's Association.

“ On Friday, September 15, 2017, many of us said our final farewells to a friend and colleague, Bill Weber. Many kind comments have been shared about Bill's caring, considerate, humble and self-less character; all which are completely true! During his illness, as Bill evaluated his treatment options, he consistently opted for those options that were the most aggressive, revolutionary and perhaps personally risky hoping these treatments could have positive outcomes not only for himself, but also advance medicine for the benefit of others. Bill's thinking as he battled his disease was classic and incorporated his constant consideration of others; "If these treatments are not able to help me, maybe my experience will help someone else down the road". No surprise, this last point became Bill's rallying cry as he battled his disease.

Bill allowed his body serve as a laboratory for the world renowned clinicians of Penn Medicine with the hope of helping himself as well as others. For a period of time, Bill's health improved and there was much to celebrate. Bill was constantly being probed, pricked, stuck and analyzed as doctors kept a close eye on him. During this time Bill never once complained nor said "Why Me?". All he kept saying was that

maybe he could be helping others in some way, shape or form. Bill was truly the John Glenn of the fight against cancer, often going where no human had gone before.

Eventually the disease returned and Bill faced it head on; becoming the first patient to enroll in a new clinical trial aimed at obliterating solid tumors. Bill welcomed the opportunity to participate; once again to help himself and others. As we know, the clinical trial did not yield the hoped for results, but true to Bill's character, he acknowledged that he did advance medicine and his sacrifices will help others. Significant progress has been made in the treatment of cancer within the United States and worldwide. I pray that none of us forget about Bill's sacrifices, his consideration of others and his contributions to the treatment of cancer.
