Lorraine Antoinette (Battista) Kilmer, born July 14, 1930 in Philadelphia, PA to Joseph Battista and Grace Pantalena Battista, died Friday, August 26, 2022 at her home holding the hand of her beloved niece Cindy.

Lorraine grew up in Philadelphia with her two older sisters Evelyn and Gloria. The three Battista girls were the pride and joy of their parents, and Lorraine was devoted to both of her sisters. Lorraine graduated from West Catholic High School attended Chestnut Hill College. Lorraine began her passion for fine art at the age of 12 when she began art lessons at Fleishman Art Gallery. Throughout her life she perfected her talent with classes at the Philadelphia Academy of Fine Arts. She was a long-time member of the Philadelphia Sketch Club up until her death..

Most of Lorraine's career was as a book designer for WB Saunders Company, a medical book publisher in Philadelphia. It was there she met her husband, David H. Kilmer, and they wed in October 1981.

Lorraine and David shared a passion for opera, and they were a frequent

presence at both Opera Philadelphia and the Metropolitan Opera in New York. They also traveled many times to the Tanglewood Music Festival in the Berkshires and also enjoyed trips to Italy, Boston and Cape May.

Lorraine was a patron of the entire Philadelphia art scene and often attended orchestral concerts, the ballet, and theater productions. She was an avid reader, and her apartment was lined with shelves containing biographies as well as art, history, and fiction books.

Lorraine was an artist in her own right, and her paintings graced her home and those of her family and friends. She helped curate and lead the biannual art show at The Philadelphian, where she resided.

After her retirement, Lorraine volunteered her time at several organizations, most especially the Library for the Blind, Manna, and Concerned Citizens of Center City. She was a member of the Pennsylvania Horticultural Society and Metropolitan Opera Guild.

Lorraine's father was a tailor, and her mother was a seamstress, so she was always aware of fashion and began creating her collection of couturier fashion. She sewed her own clothing, including suits, dresses and overcoats, and she was always "stylishly turned out" according to her friends. She was also an accomplished gourmet cook and graciously entertained her family, friends, and neighbors over the years.

Lorraine is survived by her niece Cindy Vetter and nephew Norman Vetter (who they referred to Lorraine as Aunt Lamb) and her adopted nephew Keith Glass, the son of her

dear departed friend Marty.

She is predeceased by her husband David and her two sisters.

Lorraine was known for her love of friend and family, her love of animals, especially cats, her kindness,

and compassion for others, her nonjudgmental manner, and her steadfast presence in the lives of her

friends. A funeral mass for Lorraine will be held at St. Francis Xavier Roman Catholic Church, 2319 Green

Street in Philadelphia, on September 7 at 10:30. The mass will be preceded by a viewing at 9:30. Burial

will be at St. Denis Cemetery in Havertown on September 8 at 11:00. In lieu of flowers, contributions in

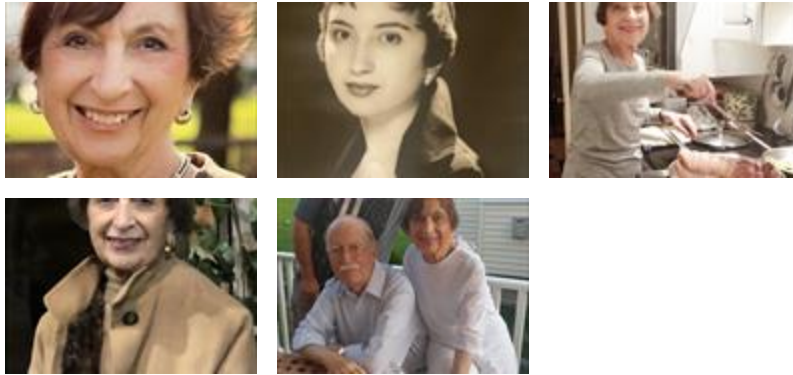
