Rev. Mark C. Aita, S.J., age 67, died peacefully at Manresa Hall, 261 City Ave., Merion Station, PA 90066. He was the son of the late Joseph Aita and Palma Baiocchi. He is survived by his brothers; Dr. Paul Aita and Dr. Joseph Aita and their families. Fr. Aita graduated with a degree in medicine from the Medical College of Pennsylvania in Phila. in 1977. He was ordained a priest in 1983. He was a clinical professor at Johns Hopkins School of Medicine in Baltimore, MD, Assistant Director at the Institute of Catholic Bioethics at St. Joseph's University in Phila.
