Tara Diane Parente, 33, passed away so unexpectedly on November 15, 2019, at Abington Memorial Hospital in Abington, Pennsylvania. She was born on May 7, 1986, in Syracuse, New York; however, she lived the majority of her life in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, the city she so passionately loved. She was a PROUD graduate of the William Penn Charter School (OPC '05, but also '04 for many years), before heading to Brown University on a full scholarship. Throughout her struggles, Tara always carried a special ability to find people who loved and cared for her. Tara held her relationships deeply. She had tremendous pride in her younger sister Shannon, or Cookie as young Tara named her baby sister, and they shared a remarkable bond. Tara was the best auntie to the fur monster Finnegan, and thoroughly enjoyed being dragged down the street by him. Tara made lasting relationships with many other people throughout her life's journey and was eternally grateful for the support she received along the way.

Tara loved neuroscience, the musical Hamilton, Philadelphia sports, and Five Below. She was known for her intellect, wit, and brilliance. She was quirky and creative and saw beauty in things most people overlooked. She found humor even in struggle and sadness. The potential of Tara's life was immense. Artist, scientist, poet, she did it all. She loved speaking in metaphors, philosophizing about life's eternal questions, and searching for a deeper meaning in just

about everything. She would often pose big existential questions for which most people did not have answers to. Those who knew her knew no one else quite like her.

On Monday, November 25, 2019, a viewing will take place at Tara's childhood church, Olivet Covenant Presbyterian Church, 22nd and Mount Vernon Streets, Philadelphia, PA 19130 at 9 a.m. Service will follow and begin at 10:30 a.m. Burial will take place at 1 p.m. at Whitemarsh Memorial Park, 1169 Limekiln Pike, Ambler, PA 19002. There will be a memorial service at the William Penn Charter School at a future date.
